1. Welcome and Intros

RH (Chair) welcomed members to the meeting and invited introductions.

2. Notes of Last Meeting

Minutes of 8.07.08 meeting were agreed as being a correct record.

3. Matters Arising

Re-offending Issues

Laurence Jones appointed as Head of YOS and starts 1 November. SS has met with Anthony May. New Youth Crime Prevention Strategy proposed to set strategic direction. Proposal for joint commissioning with City on Youth Crime Action Plan being prepared by Kings College.

Offender Management

Integrated Offender Management to be discussed at next meeting on 14th October.

4. Director of Change Update Report

SS circulated presentation (attached) and gave a brief summary/update. The recent Nottinghamshire Comprehensive Area Assessment contained a red flag for Community Safety with Crime and Anti Social behaviour figures giving cause for concern. With this in mind, SS has produced the Nottinghamshire Community Safety Strategic Plan (2008-2011).

SS said at the next responsible bodies meeting it was hoped to agree terms of reference and become Safer Nottinghamshire Board, replacing Community Safety Board. SS circulated 'Delivery of Community Safety Strategy' chart (attached). The Tactical Group becomes Delivery Support Group.

TH said that the politics of the county impacts on delivery.

RH felt that outcomes and performance were key and Delivery Support Group needs to be seen to take ownership of SS's ideas and make the Change Programme work. Group should be seen as a partnership and not an organisation. Delivery work focused on burglary and anti social behaviour could provide quick wins.

RH proposed that the next meeting of Tactical Group in October be extended to focus on taking forward aspects of Change Programme performance and outcomes.

Action: SS to set structure/facilitate October meeting.

Action: N Cook to set monthly Delivery Support Group meeting dates up to March 2009.

5. Performance Management Report

Held over.

6. LAA Update

CW said there was still work to do on Delivery Planning and JM was progressing this. Forthcoming seminars will aid the process. The Nottinghamshire Partnership event on 10th October was focusing on Safer and Stronger theme with a Market Stall approach for each indicator to raise awareness.

CW said LAA Finance Group was looking at freeing up funding for the next 2 years using reward element of the first LAA.

SS felt that it was important that the LAA Delivery Plans joined up. JM could project manage Outcome Improvement Programme.

Action: CW to circulate Market Stall information.

7. Strategic Assessments

All agreed overall framework and a county strategic assessment would be produced building on CDRP strategic assessments.

TH said Bassetlaw, Newark & Sherwood SA was complete.

RW/CR said joint APAC/MPAC SA, based on Police SA to be produced by end October.

DJ said South Notts SA draft produced to go to Strategic Group for agreement on "4 November.

CH mentioned capacity issues/analyst shortage and NC said Fire Service may have spare capacity. SS said analytical support was critical. RH said this was an issue for all and suggested a short project with a strategic/neighbourhood role or training programme be put forward to REIP for funding. SS said she would work on this with Jane Goodenough, seconded to Change Programme as Project Manager on Performance Framework. Evidence Led Solutions were also to be commissioned to pull County SA together.

Action: SS/Jane Goodenough to prepare funding bid to REIP.

8. Knife Crime

WMcD said Nottinghamshire Police has agreed to become one of ten forces involved in a national project to tackle knife crime and share best practice. The project comes with £150,000 Home Office funding and runs from August 2008 to March 2009. A Youth Crime Conference and Education Programme are being developed.

9. ASB Database

WMcD outlined ASB Database proposal. The Group did not see the need for another database/hub at this stage and felt that joining up and better information sharing were the way forward.

10. Tactical Group Funding

County funding was felt to be a partnership issue with outcomes and links to CDRP/LAA. MARAC personal alarms funding proposal tabled should go back to CDRP for consideration.

Action: CW to e-mail Application Form to Group.

11. Any Other Business

JT circulated DAAT Alcohol Survey.

CH said PSP Follow up Review to be completed by 9th December.

TC raised possibility of Ambulance Service representative on Group.
