	Active People Survey 3 data shows that Nottinghamshire has grown very little in participation levels since baseline in 2005/06, which is mirrored nationally. Ability to plan remedial action is limited due to budgetary pressures on LA partners and no new funding available for initiatives to increase adult participation Subject to funding and partner support, a Workplace Challenge encouraging employers (particularly public sector) to sign up and get their workforce more active and linking into Active Commuting agenda
